

Local Flood Analysis Public Meeting

The Tannersville Flood Advisory Committee (FAC) invites you to attend a public meeting to begin a Local Flood Analysis project in the Village of Tannersville.

A Local Flood Analysis (LFA) is a two-step process to (1) conduct an engineering analysis to determine the causes of flooding and evaluate mitigation options, and (2) undertake project design and implementation for projects that address flooding problems and are approved by the municipality. The Village of Tannersville is beginning the first phase of the LFA with an engineering analysis.

Residents are asked to come to the meeting to help identify chronic flooding areas within the Village, as well as what suggestions they may have for mitigation projects and strategies.

A presentation on the LFA process will be provided and, using large scale maps, the public will have a chance to provide input on their flooding experiences within the Village.

Residents are encouraged to attend and bring photographs, videos and stories.
